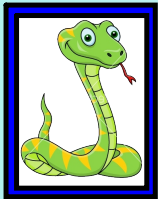

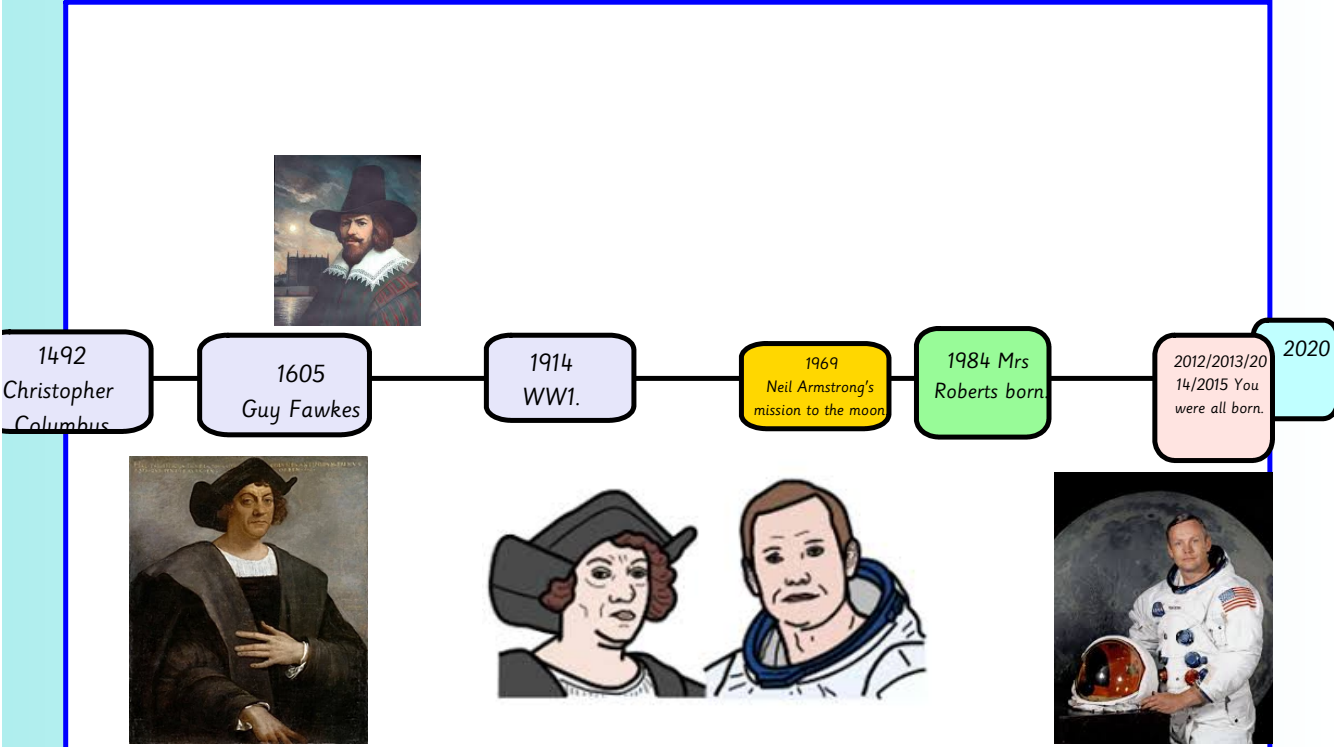

Parliament up using barrels of gun powder.*




*After Guy Fawkes and his friends were caught, this was a tradition set, to celebrate the power of the King and that the English people should respect what the King says.*
