LO: To understand and use imperative verbs.

Imperative verbs are also known as 'Bossy' verbs. When you are using imperative verbs, you are usually giving someone instructions to do something. You cannot ask someone if they would like to do the step you are giving them, you tell them that they are doing it!

get, put, jump, pack, turn

These are just a few examples of imperative verbs.
