<u>Tom</u> dragged the <u>chair</u> across the room.

Subject Object

The **passive voice** is when the subject has something done to it.

Tom was struck by a falling branch.

Subject Object

When you are in the sentence, you need to choose I or my depending on if you are active or passive.

I walked across the <u>road</u>. (Active)

Subject Object

She gave me a new book.

Subject Object

Finally, if you are both active and passive in the same sentence, you use I and myself

<u>I</u> accidentally <u>hurt</u> myself.

Subject Object

S.C.

Active if the subject is doing something.

Passive if something is done to the subject.

If you do something to yourself, use I and myself.
