Sea Creatures

We are going to look at sea creatures.

Words in green: Words that you can blend using your Phonic knowledge.

In the wild, orca whales can live between 50 and 80 years. One female orca even lived to 103.



The oldest blue whale found was around 110 years old. Average lifespan is estimated at around 80 to 90 years.

Sea turtle




Sea turtles typically live between 30 and 50 years, with some documented cases of sea turtles living as long as 150 years.

Dolphins



There are at least 44 species of dolphins divided into oceanic and river families and they are found in waters all over the world.



There are around 440 known species of sharks! They are all different sizes.



The term "shellfish" includes shrimp, crayfish, crab, lobster, clams, scallops, oysters, and mussels.
