<u>Discuss unknown/unfamiliar words:</u> Clarify and explore word choices your child found difficult or interesting. Make links within the text regarding the meaning and impact/effect of them. Why has the writer chosen this specific word?

- 1. Find and copy a word from the text which means the same as 'ripped'.
- 2. What adjectives has the author used to describe the winds and thunder?
- 3. Which suffix has the author used to slightly change the meaning of some verbs?

WEDNESDAY - HIGHER ORDER READING SKILLS - answer together with a grown up.

Recap and recall: Problematic language from yesterday - vocabulary.

Discuss Skill Focus:

Inferential - 'read between the lines' for the answer.

Questions:

- 1. How is Captain Longworth feeling about being on the pirate ship? give a reason for your answer.
- 2. How would the story have changed if the weather was better?
- 3. What might have caused the ship to be 'running out of food'?

Evaluative Question:

1. What would you have done in this situation?
