School Uniform

The pupils, staff and the Governors at the North Wolds Federation value and take pride in our schools' dress code and believe that uniform nurtures a sense of belonging. We therefore require your support in providing and encouraging the wearing of school uniform throughout the school day.

Wearing school uniform relates to our school value of respect; of the school, of the uniform and of ourselves.

This policy is underpinned by our Market Rasen Church School vision. We are an inclusive school and school uniform helps children know that they belong to our Church School Family. When our learners progress to Secondary School it is important that they are able to and comfortable wearing school uniform; starting them off on the way they should go. Reasonable adjustments may be made regarding uniform particularly if due to a special need as we respect individual differences.

The Uniform

All children are required to wear Market Rasen Church England Primary School or Nettleton Community Primary School uniform.

The Market Rasen school uniform is available from the shop at De Aston School or online at www.rasenuniform.co.uk

The Nettleton school uniform is available from the school office (very limited stock) or online at www.rasenuniform.co.uk or www.schooltrends.co.uk.

School Uniform consists of:

- White polo shirt (formal shirts, T-Shirt or blouses are not allowed)
- Jumper or Cardigan (Navy at Market Rasen, Red at Nettleton)
- Black or grey trousers, shorts, skirts or pinafore dress
- Summer Gingham dress (Blue at Market Rasen, Red at Nettleton)
 Black shoes

We would prefer children to wear the uniform with the school logo on (polo shirts, jumpers, cardigans and fleeces) available from our uniform suppliers however appreciate that this is parental choice.

Please note that the following are not permitted in school

- High heels, heels, trainings shoes or boots.
- Extreme hair styles
- Earrings other than stud earrings

On the days children have P.E they should come in their P.E Uniform for that whole day. The P.E Uniform they should wear is described below. Parents should ensure the P.E Uniform they wear is suitable for the weather.

For Outdoor PE

A blue or black tracksuit. (No designs or branded clothing please) Training shoes (Preferably dark) Hair tie for long hair if required

For Indoor PE:

T Shirt (House colour at Market Rasen C of E / White T-Shirt Nettleton Community Primary)
Black Shorts
Plimsolls
Named P.E bag
Hair Tie for long hair

For Swimming:

One piece costume Towel Brush or comb Goggles (optional)

Make Up:

This must not be worn in school by any child, including nail polish on fingers or toes.

Jewellery:

Children may wear stud earrings if they wish. Other types of earrings in school can be dangerous and may not be worn. Children should not wear any other form of jewellery including rings and chains. Children must be able to remove earrings on their own in order to take part in Physical Education.

Religion:

If there is a religious reason for a piece of jewellery or clothing to be worn please discuss this with the head teacher.

SEND:

If your child needs a reasonable adjustment to the uniform policy for due to any special needs they may have, for example sensory issues, please contact our SENCo to discuss this fully.
