

Changes From Before Christmas


There are only a few changes from before the most recent national lockdown. The main changes are:

- 1) Staff will wear face coverings at points of the school day though not when in class
- 2) The vast majority of staff are being tested for COVID 19 twice a week
- 3) All parents are asked to wear face coverings when coming on site, if they are able to



How We Will Keep Your Child Safe?

- 1) We will minimise contact with people who are unwell
- 2) We will ensure regular hand cleaning or sanitisation throughout the school day
- 3) We will encourage good respiratory hygiene
- 4) We will enhance the cleaning of bubbles, shared areas and toilets
- 5) We will minimise contacts wherever possible
- 6) Most staff will wear face coverings when they are outside of their bubble area
- 7) Most staff are being tested for COVID 19 twice a week



Minimising Contact With People Who Are Unwell

- No one showing COVID 19 symptoms will be allowed on site
- Any adults showing COVID 19 symptoms during the day will go home immediately
- Any children showing COVID19 symptoms will be removed to a safe area until they can be collected
- Anyone unwell will be asked to arrange a COVID 19 test; we can support you with this

Help Us: Please do not come onto site or allow your child to come onto site if they have COVID 19 Symptoms. (High temperature, persistent cough, loss of smell or taste.) Also help us by wearing a mask when you come onto the school site



Regular Handwashing Throughout The Day

- Children will clean their hands regularly throughout the school day particularly:
 - Before and after breaks
 - After touching shared resources
 - Before and after P.E.
 - If they have used a shared room

Help Us: Please ensure your child has washed their hands before they leave for school and as soon as they get home. If they need a special soap or hand cream (non prescribed), please name this and bring it into school



Good Respiratory Hygiene

- We will teach the children and ensure they follow the “*Catch It, Bin It, Kill It*” guidance
- Each classroom has special lidded bins for tissues
- Children will wash hands if they blow their nose, sneeze, touch their face etc

Help Us: Use the “*Catch It, Bin It, Kill It*” routine at home too

CATCH IT

Germs spread easily. Always carry tissues and use them to catch your cough or sneeze.



BIN IT

Germs can live for several hours on tissues. Dispose of your tissue as soon as possible.




KILL IT

Hands can transfer germs to every surface you touch. Clean your hands as soon as you can.



Enhanced Cleaning


- The school has an enhanced clean every night. Every surface that can be touched is cleaned thoroughly
- There is additional in day cleaning of classrooms (tables, light switches, resources, taps, door handles etc)
- There is more regular cleaning of toilets
- Any shared areas that are used will be cleaned between bubble groups



Minimising Contacts Where Possible



- Each class will be its own protective bubble (*Kites Bubble / Class 1 Bubble*)
- Children will only mix with children in their bubble during the school day
- Adults will be assigned to bubbles; usually a Teacher, a Teaching Assistant and a Lunchtime Supervisor
- At Market Rasen Mr Toothill will resume P.E lessons for all classes however social distancing will be employed

Help Us: Please don't attempt to enter the school buildings and socially distance when visiting the main office.



Visitors

- Only essential visitors will be allowed into school
- Full contact details of all visitors will be taken to support NHS Test and Trace if needed



Aim Of Bubbles

- To reduce transmission of the COVID-19 virus if it were in school
- To avoid a full school closure if anyone in school tests positive for COVID-19. In this case we would usually only close the bubble where the positive test occurred.




Playtimes And Lunchtimes

- At playtime children will only be able to play with children in their bubble. Each bubble will have their own set of play equipment, that only they use
- At lunchtime children will eat in class or outside if it is nice, with their bubble group. They will not be able to play with children outside of their bubble



Timings

- We will employ staggered start, end times, lunchtimes and playtimes
- Maximum wait time for parents with multiple children at Market Rasen C of E Primary is 20 minutes
 - i.e 8.40 and 9.00 drop offs
 - i.e 3.00 and 3.20 pick ups
- In rare cases when a parents needs to be in two places at once we will support you; please just ask us



Helping Us At The Start And The End Of The Day

- Only 1 adult to enter the site to drop off a child
- Please keep 2 mtrs away from other adults and other peoples children
- Adults should not stand with their children once they are in their line
- Children cannot play before school. They should line up on the blue/red markings. They do not need to be 2 mtrs away from other children in their bubble




Before and After school

- Nettleton CPS will continue with the before school Breakfast Club. Children will be seated in their bubble groups in Beeches.




Borrowed Devices For Home Learning

- Please ensure the P.E kit is suitable for the weather conditions. Children will go outside even if the weather is inclement



Help Us: Please don't bring in toys, comforters, fiddle toys etc unless agreed with our SENCo Mrs Lianne McGagh




Recovery Curriculum


- We will continue with our recovery curriculum that started in September 2020
