


To be successful I must be able to:


- Use the letters in the word "caterpillar" to create different smaller words.

- Write the correct grapheme for the phoneme, using a mat to help me.




Yesterday we read this story about a caterpillar.

Success Criteria:


Segment each word out loud, and write the graphemes in order.
