Weekly Safeguarding Meetings

Weekly safeguarding meetings will be held every week involving the Executive Headteacher, Head of School, SENCO and Parent Support Advisor will continue. Every children that is open to CP, CIN, TAC, Early Help or PSA support will be discussed in this meeting.

Vulnerable Children in Self Isolation

If a vulnerable child is in self isolation (a child open to CP, CIN, TAC or Early Help) they will receive a call at least once a week (more if it is deemed appropriate) to ensure their wellbeing. Children in ELSA can continue this remotely with parent's permission. The school will inform the social work or lead professional should a child be isolating.

Working with Professionals

Essential visitors will be able to come into school following their own organisations risk assessment and our infection control measures. These include Family Support Workers, Social Workers, health professionals and outreach services. This list is not exhaustive. Where meetings do not need to be held onsite they will be done via TEAMS.

Pupil Mental Health

Any concern about a pupil's mental health as a result of the COVID19 crisis will be taken seriously. On each site we have staff trained in mental health first aid. Any staff or parental concerns about pupil mental health will be passed to our SENCo or Parental Support Advisor.

Use of CPOMS

CPOMS continues to be used to report any concerns in the following categories.

- Allegation of harm
- Child presenting with an injury that we are concerns about
- Sharing Information
- Any concern about a child
- Allegation of bullying
- Poor Behaviour
- Attendance issues

All staff had refresher training in CPOMS in October 2020.

Staff will continue to tell a DSL if they have logged something on CPOMS that needs to be urgently looked into. They will do this in a socially distanced way, following our infection control measures, whilst keeping confidentiality.

New Staff

Any new staff employed will have the same safeguarding checks and safeguarding training and induction and pre pandemic. The only difference will be interviews may be conducted online.

Safeguarding Online Learning

Online learning for bubble closure or school closure will be provided through our school websites. www.marketrasen.lincs.sch.uk www.nettleton.lincs.sch.uk

Parents will be given regular reminders to ensure children are supervised when using the internet.

“Live lessons” will be pre-recorded using MS Teams. Children will not interact with teachers so there is no chance of children being seen in their home environment.

In the case of bubble closure, lessons will not be streamed live from school to ensure images of children in school cannot be seen outside of school.

Children Eligible for Free School Meals.

Children eligible for Free School meals will have a food parcel deliveries (compliant with food standards) for the duration of their absence. Vulnerable families have access to our food bank that is run by Nichola Allerston.

Governors Safeguarding Checks

All governor safeguarding checks as outlined in the North Wolds Federation governors monitoring and evaluation schedule, will continue to take place remotely. COVID19 will not be used as an excuse to not do these checks.

Staff Safeguarding Training

Adaptations will be made to the delivery methods of training to ensure that we continue to follow the 6 year safeguarding pathway approved by the North Wolds Federation Governing Body. This applies to all staff and Designated Safeguarding Leads.

Elective Home Education

If a request for EHE is made the Executive Headteacher will follow the most up to date guidance from the Local Authority. Wherever possible children should not become EHE due to fear of COVID19.

CME

Attendance registers will be closely monitored and the CME policy will be followed if children meet the trigger points.
